Declaration under Article 63 of the Firearms (Northern Ireland) Order 2004

It is an offence for a person who is prohibited by Article 63 of the Firearms (Northern Ireland) Order 2004 to have a firearm or ammunition in his/her possession at any time during their prohibition.

This Section applies to any person who has been sentenced to imprisonment or to detention in a young offender's centre or a juvenile justice centre for three months or more.

- A person sentenced to a period of imprisonment or detention in a young offenders' centre of 3 years or more is prohibited for life.
- A person sentenced to a period of imprisonment, detention in a young offenders' centre
 or a juvenile justice centre sentenced to a period between 3 months and 3 years is
 prohibited for 8 years from the date of conviction.
- A person who has been sentenced to detention during the pleasure of the Minister of Justice under Article 45(1) of the Criminal Justice (Children) (Northern Ireland) Order 1998 (NI 9) is prohibited for life.
- Anyone prohibited by Section 21 of the 1968 Firearms Act shall be deemed to be prohibited within Northern Ireland.

It is an offence for a person to transfer, let, hire, or lend a firearm or ammunition to someone whom he knows or has reasonable grounds for believing to be a prohibited person.

It is an offence to make a false declaration.

I declare that I am not a prohibited person by virtue of Article 63 of the Firearms (Northern Ireland) Order 2004 or Section 21 of the Firearms Act 1968.

I also declare that I have never had a firearm certificate revoked at any time.
